Flying bridge features athwartships seating forward of the control console; one-piece stainless steel grab rail; forward-raking venturi windshield for superior spray protection and complete control station with helm seat.





The 12V DC and 120V AC electrical systems include distribution panels with magnetic circuit breakers; ground fault protection on AC outlets; transformer connected, fused shoreline inlets; heavy duty electrical wiring harnesses secured against vibration and chafing damage; color coding and numbering of wires for easy identification.

Seacocks on underwater thru-hull fittings. Complete bonding for corrosion control.

Fiberglass tanks for durability.

Hatteras Systems Monitor which senses four crucial functions on each engine/drive gear. Plus, it monitors the discharge of the automatic engine area fire extinguisher system.

Fresh water cooling for main engines and optional generator.

Fresh water pressure system with water heater.

The galley: ac/dc refrigerator and freezer, stainless steel sink, 2 burner

stove, loads of storage lockers and provision for an optional microwave oven.

Serve your guests at a dinette. There's ample storage under. And it converts to a double berth.

The bow stateroom. It's carpeted; has wide, 6'6" long berths; lots of storage drawers and hanging locker.

The head. It's complete with electric toilet, sink, shower with curtain, medicine cabinet, mir-

ror and linen storage locker.

Step into the large cockpit. It can handle a fishing party or a family party. There's room for

a fighting chair, ice chests, rods and gear. At the forward end are two large, hinged fiberglass engine boxes that swing up and out of the way for easy access to engine maintenance. Optional is a large flush-deck fishbox.







Climb up to the flybridge. It's uncommonly large for a boat of this class. With plenty of built-in seating forward of the console.

Set your hands on the stainless steel wheel and take charge. Steering is hydraulic. You have excellent vision all around, even into the cockpit. The central console is complete with instruments and switches, twin throttle and clutch controls and storage bins are designed to house a good selection of electronics.

Considering all that goes into and comes with a Hatteras, your boating life should be mostly play and very little work.

A close inspection of the Hatteras 32 Flybridge Fisherman makes the meaning

crystal clear.

This boat's modified-vee, constant deadrise hull planes quickly, runs true. And it's wonderfully stable. All characteristics demanded by Hatteras of its designer, Jim Wynne.

Moreover, the hull's sharp entry and flared bow result in a softened ride in the swells and chop. Spray is deflected down and away. And tracking is true in turns and quartering seas because of a carefully chosen keel design.

So much for hull shape and on to what

keeps the hull in shape.

The 32 Flybridge has its tough, coredfiberglass hull stiffened with a fiberglass stringer system of great strength. System design is such that it smoothly distributes the torque and weight loads of engines and drive gears.

Top speed for the 32 Flybridge is the result of early "match making" by Hatteras engineers. Hull shape, structure and weight are selected, in the design stage, to best match the engines' weight and power output.

The 32's operating systems, as on every Hatteras, receive a large infusion of reliability. That's a great comfort to fishermen and families who like to venture offshore for

a day's outing.
