


41 CONVERTIBLE

Because now there's the unique Hatteras 41 Convertible, born and bred of the spirit and determination that began with the first Hatteras over a quarter of a century ago.

The very first Hatteras back then was also a 41, the "Knit Wits." It revolutionized sport fishing. With today's Hatteras 41C, history repeats itself...with a convertible that combines state-of-the-art engineering with the art-of-the-craftsman Hatteras workmanship.

Everything about this Hatteras 41 Convertible represents a truly bold and exciting statement. Hatteras designers and engineers started with a clean sheet of paper; they eliminated all preconceived notions of what a Hatteras should be like; and then they set out to create a comfortable, offshore fishing boat that your whole family will enjoy. They achieved their goal and yours, without sacrificing performance, livability, or time-honored Hatteras values.

The result is a pace-setting combination of the new and the tried-and-true, with features big and small that have everyone who has seen them excited

in whole new ways.

The Hatteras hull was designed by noted naval architect Jack Hargrave. It cuts through the sea like a steak knife through a key lime pie — yet the modified-V configuration can give you a steadier fishing platform the way a real fishing machine should.

Then today's advanced technology goes to work, with weight-reduction without strength reduction, for performance benefits you'll reap for years. Everywhere you turn, the Hatteras 41C represents the latest in boat-building technique.

Advanced vacuum molding processes were employed, for example, so that bulkheads, decks, and stringers could be produced of a special

reduced-weight composite material. And the fiberglass hull is a cored structure from the waterline up, with a solid laminate bottom for strength against the sea.

It took two years to accomplish.

But it was worth it.

Now, if you think that by talking about stringer systems and superstructures we're getting a little too close to it, step back on the dock a moment.

Look it over. The exterior styling, the sculptured lines, the rakish bridge, the stepped sheer line. When we said we started with a clean sheet of paper, we meant it.

Now go aboard again. The 125-square-foot cockpit means business, and lots of it. It continues the sculptured look, and has, as standard equipment, a molded-in bait and tackle center tucked neatly against the forward bulkhead.

Because you're as serious about fishing as we are, you'll be glad to know that the tackle center features a built-in sink, tackle drawers, and storage compartments. An optional freezer or circulating baitwell is available for the portside storage unit. Another option you can choose is a removable fish box, flush in sole.

And the tackle center has room for optional controls,

which are hidden away when not in use.

Above, a flying bridge that will, indeed, make you



feel like flying. It features a complete control station — plus two helm chairs, covered electronics box, and two cushioned bench seats, with good rod storage beneath the port seat.

By now, maybe you're saying to yourself, "Sure, Hatteras has devoted itself to the thrill of the hunt,


but what about me?'

Glad you asked. When it comes to luxury, a Hatteras has always been something. And the 41C is something else!

## Even without all that's new, it's still all Hatteras.

You can hear how special the Hatteras 41C is inside. The oohs and ahhs become almost automatic as soon as someone steps inside, surrounded with the blending of warm, natural wood veneers with contemporary vinyls and high pressure laminates.

The salon is 132-square feet of Hatteras luxury . . . living space designed for those who really know how to live. To starboard, it features a built-in lounge, with a hydraulic-assisted rod storage locker concealed inside. And just forward of the lounge is a built-in entertainment center with color television and an AM/FM stereo cassette tape player. The hi-lo table and side chair are also provided.



The Salon is expansive. with the extensive use of windows for a wide-open look. It becomes apparent very quickly that the sport fishing life and your family life can add up to one great lifestyle.


Alternate galley down arrangement is available.

The galley area is one of the most tasteful (and convenient) we've ever done. It works like a galley, but it doesn't look like a kitchen. It has a large ice maker, refrigerator/freezer, three-burner range with an oven, a countertop stainless steel sink, and really enough storage space. (This is a family affair, remember.) And there's also a built-in microwave/convection oven.

Next, let's retire to the owner's stateroom. The attention to details (details to others, perhaps, but very important to Hatteras) never ends. Here a tapered queen berth maximizes the roominess without minimizing your need for comfort and peace of mind. The contemporary Hatteras touches include molded corners on the twin dressers (with drawers), an attractive headboard bulkhead with a shelf above, and hullside covering of light-colored sueded vinyl which adds to the feeling of roominess. Twin full-height hanging lockers with mirrors add the space you want.

The head is adjoining, for complete privacy. You'll enjoy the stall shower, with a clear safety glass door, and the touch of molded onyx for the lavatory. The sink is molded-in as well, and there's a storage cabinet with mirrored sliding doors. The head is also accessible from the companionway for the use of your quests.

The comfortable guest stateroom features upper and lower berths, a nightstand, and a unique combination dresser and locker. Any guest of yours deserves plenty — space, storage, and the Hatteras feeling of specialness.

All in all, the more time you spend aboard the Hatteras 41 Convertible, the more you'll discover.

To any current Hatteras owner, it goes without saying that your investment in pleasure will be enhanced by the famous Hatteras electrical and mechanical systems; the famous Hatteras engineering and design expertise; and the famous Hatteras reputation for building magnificent sleep-aboard yachts.
