Hatteras 55 CONVERTIBLE




Running hard like a bat out of the canyons, the Hatteras 55 Convertible looks so at home in open water, it's difficult to imagine her tethered to the dock. Here is one free-spirited machine, one sportfisherman bred solely for the purpose of taking the best fish, the best trophies. Let there be no doubt: this is one of the brightest examples of how Hatteras has set the standards for the sport.

Here is one truly well-made weapon in the battle for billfish.

Comfortably positioned at the head of the fifty-foot class, the Hatteras 55 balances the agility of smaller boats

with as much working space as the supers. Broad beamed and maneuverable, the 55 has the flexibility to properly seek and land the big fish. Solid and single-minded in design, the 55 provides 158 square feet of cockpit space — plenty of room for fighting the largest blacks and blues.

Overall, the business end of this boat is built for biggame action. Its standard bait and tackle console includes a wet sink, bait work area, tackle compartments, and freezer. And there's enough space left over for optional clutch and throttle controls, or a circulating bait well. Of course, a Hatteras-size extra large transom gate is standard, and a



flush-deck fish box can be added.

In the 55, you can go directly from the cockpit to the engine room below — thanks to a direct access door. The engine room itself is an impressive example of Hatteras's thoughtful approach to design engineering: unlike most other boats in this class, there's plenty of stand-up room here, and good access to all mechanical and electrical components below.

We've equipped the 55 with lots of horsepower in Detroit Diesel 12's, to get you out and back quickly. And, to keep the engine room free from spray and hullside wash, engine air is drawn from intakes located under the cockpit's coaming.

Above decks, the flybridge is aggressively styled, yet sufficiently spacious for helmsman, crew and guests. The low, aft-raking windshield, the radius forward corners of the bridge and house, and styled side windows produce a clean, low look to the 55. But don't be deceived: the Hatteras traditions for maximized use of space, extra headroom and quality amenities are maintained throughout this convertible.

All in all, from any aspect or angle, the Hatteras 55 Convertible is an impressive sportfishing weapon indeed.

washer/dryer.


Floor plan efficiency is quite clear to anyone, once aboard. Topside and below, special consideration has been given to traffic patterns. In the deckhouse of the optional arrangement, for example, the galley, dinette, and salon each maintain separate out-of-the-companionway spaces, while working together to form a large common and comfortable living area.


